Class of the Month - Acorn

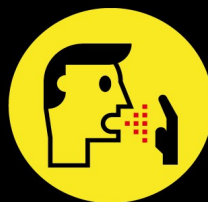
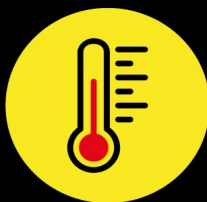
Another tough decision this month, but in the end the vote goes to Acorn class.
